Thank you for your interest in the Ministry Apprenticeship Program! We look forward to receiving your application.

The following materials are required to complete your application:

1. Completed application form
2. Personal essays (all in one MS Word/PDF document)
3. Video submission
4. Three letters of reference

Please send items 1-3 as attachments or download links in a single email to map@stpaulsbloor.org. Make the subject line "MAP Application: [YOUR NAME]". Letters of reference should be sent directly by your references to map@stpaulsbloor.org.

All application materials, including letters of reference, must be received by **April 14, 2023**. Late/incomplete applications will not be considered.

Applicants selected for Zoom interviews will be notified by early May, with final admission decisions following by the end of May. Admitted applicants must indicate their decision by June 12, 2023, and submit a nonrefundable program fee of \$500 to hold their space.

Core program expenses are covered by generous donations from the St. Paul's community. To situate the program within a broader community of support, we also ask Apprentices to secure prayer commitments and financial sponsors for MAP from among their home church communities. MAP will help Apprentices in these efforts by supplying materials describing the program and sponsorship cards for people to indicate prayer and financial support.

A commitment to economic justice is a core part of the MAP mandate to raise up leaders from diverse groups. If financial concerns present an obstacle to your applying or participating in MAP, please let me know so we can discuss your situation.

1. Why would you like to participate in MAP? (300 words maximum)
2. What is the gospel? (300 words maximum)
3. What is your favourite part of the Bible, and why? (300 words maximum)
4. Write a brief spiritual autobiography, including your inspirations in ministry and current thinking about the possibility of church/ordained service (500-1000 words)

Video Submission

In a video submission (3-5 minutes maximum), tell us your answer to one of the following questions. Videos can be submitted as attachments or download links.

- What's the hardest thing you've ever done?
- What's the most beautiful thing you've ever encountered?

References

The MAP application also requires three letters of reference: academic, church/ministry, and personal. Letters must be submitted directly by the references (i.e., not through you) to map@stpaulsbloor.org and must be received by the application deadline of **April 14, 2023**. Please note that it is your responsibility to ensure that letters have been submitted by the deadline. Applications will not be considered without all three letters of reference, and no extensions will be granted.

Please send the below paragraph to your references when requesting a letter:

The Ministry Apprenticeship Program at St. Paul's Bloor Street is a year-long, full-time program for young people wishing to discern a possible vocation in church service/ordained ministry in the Anglican Church of Canada. The program includes: 1) hands-on work in the various departments of a large, diverse, urban parish; 2) individual and group coaching by ministry and lay leaders; 3) exposure to graduate-level theological study. Apprentices will be admitted in cohorts of 3-5 people and will live in residence at Wycliffe College, Toronto. If you believe that the applicant would benefit from and contribute to MAP, the admissions committee would be grateful for your reflections on any/all of the following areas on which you feel able to comment: the applicant's personal and spiritual maturity and curiosity; academic ability and record; ability to work well in a group/community; and significant areas of strength/weakness.
